Pastoral Team

- Team meetings to discuss strategy, ideas, project work, support for pastoral visitors.
- 4 Pastoral visitors- meet weekly with ministerial team to share and identify visits needed, discuss visits made and provide support for one another, prayer and learning/ teaching
- Confidential list of names of those requiring visitsthose in hospital, care homes ill, bereaved, isolated, elderly
- Links with elders



What do we do?

- Visits by pastoral visitors
- Timed visits after bereavement and card to mark first anniversary
- Home communion where needed or requested
- Birthday cards for children up to 3 who have been baptised or blessed
- Church flower distribution
- Gardening
- Involvement with 'Safe Families'
- Development of resources/ tool box for visitors e.g. prayer cards



What do we do?

Bereavement group



- Model used: Tom Gordon's 'Stepping stones'
- 6 sessions with topics and speakers
- Community resource
- Run jointly with other local Churches and undertakers and registrar
- Meet in neutral space
- Faith shared if asked
- extra session for individuals to access if they wish on 'religious perspectives on death and dying'



New Initiatives

- Supper club for those who have been bereaved
- Minister's 'afternoon tea'



- Exploring materials for working with young families. Care for the families 'Parentalk'
- Expand our pastoral team and visits for younger families/ parents in need



Identifying the right people/ learning and teaching

- Invitations from the minister to those with pastoral gifts: alongside SHAPE seminar (Spiritual gifts, Heart, Abilities, Personality, Experiences)
- Good communicators and listeners, caring and interested in others, some have professional background
- Monthly breakfast and book study growing deeper/ developing faith
- Annual away day Bield
- Dementia awareness and strategies
- Bereavement and being a good listener workshop
