

This Church:

- 1. Believes that violence against women, girls and children in all of its many forms is unacceptable and irreconcilable with our Christian faith and our Christian way of life
- 2. Accepts that such violence is a serious and common problem and affects those in the life of the Church as well as in wider society
- 3. Teaches that men and women are equally made in God's image and reflects on what this means for our lives
- 4. Condemns any violence against women, girls and children and teaches that such abuse is a sin
- 5. Understands violence against women, girls and children to be rooted in gender inequality and is an abuse of power and privilege
- 6. Undertakes to listen to, and, where appropriate, provide pastoral support to those affected by violence against women, girls and children
- 7. Will always prioritise the safety of those affected by violence against women, girls and children
- 8. Will seek to create links with local support services, work with them, support them, refer survivors to them and publicise their work when appropriate
- 9. Has signed up to the Church of Scotland Safeguarding Service's Domestic Abuse Charter
- 10. Has appointed/Will work toward appointing a Violence against Women representative in our Church to oversee the work we do as part of this Charter
