Overview

We hope that the ideas included in this document will be a practical aid as you plan for the annual service of dedication, whenever and wherever that may be held. It can be used over a number of years, in part or as a whole, depending on your circumstances. The lists of readings and hymns are simply there as suggestions, to be used or not. The prayers can be used as they are, adapted or replaced to suit your own needs. The Guild members' Act of Dedication is intended to be used as it is.

By holding an annual dedication service, each member (and the wider congregation, if present) are reminded of the purpose of the Guild and the commitment that membership entails.

The service is a precious opportunity to acknowledge our dependence on each other and on Jesus Christ, whose Spirit enables us.

Aim

"The Church of Scotland Guild is a movement within the Church of Scotland which invites and encourages both women and men to commit their lives to Jesus Christ and enables them to express their faith in worship, prayer and action."

Motto

"Whose we are and Whom we serve."

When?

Guild Week seems the obvious choice, but other times of the year might be more convenient.

By choosing to tie the service in with Guild Week, it gives you a natural way in which to introduce the Guild Projects that are going to be supported in the year ahead.

Where?

- o In Sunday worship, morning or evening, with the whole congregation
- o Mid-week in your usual meeting place

What else should we consider?

- Simple and effective is better than overly complex and confusing!
- Do you have someone willing to write/deliver prayers or a reflection?
- Do you have a musician or access to prepared music?
- Theme
 - Is it going to be purely a dedication service?
 - o Is it a chance to briefly talk about the project/s for the year ahead?

Suggested formats

The Order of Service

This will depend on where and when the service is going to be held:

Longer service

Welcome Call to worship Hymn Opening prayer and The Lord's Prayer Bible reading Hymn Sermon or reflection Guild Act of Dedication (please stand as you are able) Hymn Prayers of thanksgiving, prayers for others Offering with prayer Hymn Benediction

Shorter service

Welcome Call to worship Hymn Opening prayer and The Lord's Prayer Bible reading Time for reflection (words or music) Guild Act of Dedication (please stand as you are able) Prayers of thanksgiving and prayers for others Offering and prayer Hymn Benediction

Elements within the service

It is good to have a clear link between each element of worship and the best place to start is with the Bible reading. Everything else can flow from that. At the back of CH4, there is an index of Bible passages and hymns that relate to each text.

Once the service has started, always allow plenty of time between each element—time for people to stand/sit/ settle down for or to finish their prayer time etc.

Don't be afraid of moments of silence.

Welcome

- Welcome everyone to the service and explain briefly what will happen within the service
- If you have planned refreshments after the service, give the invitation
- If the offering is to be given for, e.g. one of the Guild projects, intimate this at this point
- Thank in advance those who have made the service possible.

Call to worship

The Psalms are a good place to start:

- Psalm 95: 6-7
 Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker; for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care.
- Psalm 96: 1-2

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day.

- Psalm 117: 1-2 Praise the Lord, all you nations; extol him, all you peoples. For great is his love towards us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures for ever. Praise the Lord.
- Psalm 146: 1-2 Praise the Lord. Praise the Lord, my soul. I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live.
- Psalm 147: 1 Praise the Lord. How good it is to sing praises to our God, how pleasant and fitting praise him!
- Psalm 148: 1-2 Praise the Lord. Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights above. Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his heavenly hosts.
- Psalm 150: 1, 2 and 6

Praise the Lord. Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens. Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness. Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord.

Bible readings and hymn suggestions by theme

Take time to read through different Bible translations to see which is best for your service. Have a look at the Dramatized Bible if you have a number of good readers, as some readings can be split for two voices (e.g. Jesus speaking versus the rest of the passage).

Prayer examples

(These are merely suggestions, to be added to or amended to suit your service.)

Opening Prayer (Approach, adoration, confession and absolution)

Almighty God, Creator, Son and Holy Spirit, as we meet together in worship, we acknowledge our smallness and your greatness. You are beyond anything we can ever imagine and yet you love each one of us as a parent who loves their child.

We humbly come before you, recognising our need of forgiveness and grace, for we constantly fall short of the standard you set for our living with you. Forgive our wrongdoing and waywardness, we pray... (@ 30 seconds of silence)

God hears us.

He is merciful and forgiving, accepting us as we are, wayward, humble servants whose deepest desire is to follow him.

Gracious and eternal God, as we worship now, may we know your blessing on us. As we reflect on your Word, sing your praise and dedicate ourselves to the work of the Guild, may we truly feel your presence within us, prompting, guarding and guiding our lives. We pray in Jesus' name and for his sake. Amen

The Lord's Prayer (according to your custom):

- either here
- after the prayer of thanks and intercession
- or after the offertory prayer

Prayer of thanks and intercession

We lift our hearts to you, our God, and we thank you for the fullness of life that you give us in Christ Jesus. We thank you for the example of his life, the truth of his words and the new life he offers through the power of his resurrection.

Living Lord,

we lay before you now our concerns for others. We pray for your Church here in Scotland, and throughout the world, and we ask that you will sustain and bless all, who by their words and actions, seek to spread the Good News to all people.

We pray for harmony amongst all who follow the way of Jesus Christ, for barriers between denominations to be swept away, and for all to be united in their aim to serve you, and do your will. We ask your blessing on organisations within the Church: (*insert your own congregation's organisations here*)

And at this time, we remember especially the Guild and affiliated groups, the projects they support at home and abroad. Guide and inspire all who plan for the future, and encourage those who deal with the day to day tasks which make it all possible.

We pray for the leaders of nations, communities, industry and the caring services and we ask that each will use their influence wisely and with compassion so that all they do is acceptable to you. We pray for peace within families, within communities and between nations.

In a moment of quiet, we pray for those we know who are ill, and for those who are bereaved... (silence)

Heavenly Father,

there are many who have secret sorrows and anxieties. May all who are weary and burdened with a load of care find comfort in the knowledge that you are always with them.

All this we pray in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour, Amen.

Offertory Prayer

Loving God, who freely gives to all who ask, accept these gifts of money and bless them, that they might be used to further your kingdom here on earth. Amen.

Words of sending/ Benedictions

Suggestions:

God is waiting for us in the world. May we go now, to live in the way of truth and love, guided by God's voice within us.

Eternal God, behind us, before us, within us, go with us on our journey.

We go now, to live and work to God's praise and glory. We have been set free to love and serve one another – let us do so with joy, knowing that we do God's will.

Guild Members' Act of Dedication

(Said together, standing if appropriate)

In faith,

we now dedicate ourselves, through our worship, payer and action, to serve you faithfully, to love you with all our heart, all our soul and all our mind, and to love one another as your Son, Jesus Christ, has shown his love for us.

Renew us, refresh us, as members of the Guild, as we continue on our journey through life. Guide our thinking and bless all that we do you your name, whose we are and whom we serve, and in whose name we pray. Amen

Sermon/reflection (Optional)

- It may be that you have a guest speaker or a worship leader to lead this part of the service
- It might be appropriate to play some reflective music, allowing each person to reflect quietly as they listen
- You might prefer to read a reflection from a published book
- If you have access to audio-visual equipment, you might find a clip that fits with the theme
