The property is connected to a mains supplies of water and electricity.

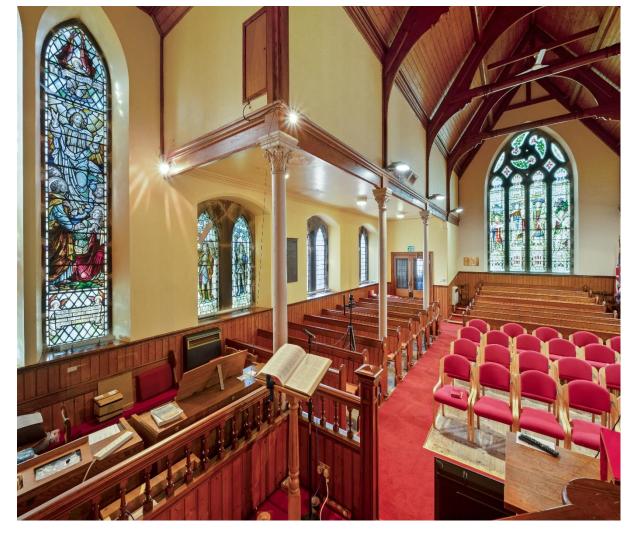
Drainage goes into the main public sewer.
