Services


The property is connected to mains supply of water and electricity. Drainage is connected to the main public sewer.

It also has potential for a variety of other uses, such as a theatre, cinema or entertainment venue, retail space or community resource subject to obtaining appropriate consents.








Local Area

The property is located in a quiet rural location close to the Cairngorm National Park and a short drive from the village of Alford. Lumsden offers a local primary school with larger amenities being available at Alford including a secondary school. There is also a medical centre, dental and veterinary practice, post office and pharmacy. Leisure facilities include 18-hole golf course, bowling, tennis courts, country parks and dry ski centre. Aberdeen is approximately 35 miles away and larger supermarkets and rail links are available at Huntly which is 14 miles.























Offers
