Members appointed by the wider Church (6) (at present Scottish Episcopal, Scottish Baptist, Scottish Quakers, the Roman Catholic Church in Scotland, and a representative from Argyll Presbytery) 4. The Leader of the Iona Community is always in attendance. The current Leader is Ruth Harvey.
